

2021 STARTING POINT REPORT AND ANALYSIS FOR CLUBS AND STATE ASSOCIATIONS


A new AVA IT feature has been implemented that can be used to create a **2021 Starting Point report PDF** for Clubs and State Associations. This report has two parts. The *first* part presents YRE/SE information as it will appear in the upcoming 2021 Starting Point book. The report's *second* part is a summary listing of the same events that includes an analysis of where improvements are recommended (typically missing data). Both parts are preceded by a single page of explanatory text applicable to the following pages.

The goal of this report is to encourage clubs to improve their event content by making use of the new my.ava.org event data features that will appear in the 2021 Starting Point Book.

GROUP "CUT AND PASTE" STAMPS - A NEW STAMP FEATURE

Chris here with a "<u>my.ava.org</u>" update. My club, the South bay Striders, wanted a stamp with the World Walking Day dove logo for our WWD event on October 4th, this Sunday. Not being one to disappoint, I have created group "*cut and paste*" stamps as an option on "<u>my.ava.org</u>". These group stamps can be used at any event instead of a rubber stamp.

There is an option to add a little graphic instead of the usual text. This is all in keeping with the stamps being fun to collect.

To see what the options are, log into your personal account on "<u>my.ava.org</u>". Click the link to your club (Select connections under profile if you haven't set this up). Under the Sanctions tab, select Stamps. Click "*Cut & Paste*" for the event. This page lets you create stamps for an individual, or for a group. Click to select the WWD dove, and then "*Update preview image*". Put the date (Oct 4th) on the stamp, then download and print the stamp page.

You may print as many copies of the page that you need for all participants, there are 30 stamps per page. Please warn everyone that they may only put one of these unique (Security code) stamps in any book. Duplicate or defaced stamps in a book are rejected.

You will notice that there are a few other options available for stamps. It is pretty easy to add more. Read the help on the page to see how you can submit other ideas. We will have images for major holidays and events when time permits. Please enjoy this new feature. My club was thrilled.

THANK YOU FOR VISITING OUR STATE PARKS

Suzy Belle here, saying a very big Iowa thank you to all of you who came and helped celebrate 100 years of state parks in Iowa. Iowa is a special place and our state parks showcase our scenic landscapes! We really appreciated your enthusiasm for our walks. We hope you enjoyed your visit to "the most beautiful land beneath the sun".

Iowa has been a national leader in park development since the 1920's. The passage of Iowa's State Parks Act in 1917, made Iowa a national leader in the creation of a state park system in an organized manner. The first park, Backbone state park (sadly, not one of our 20 walks) was dedicated May 28, 1920. More parks, forests, preserves and recreation areas followed. So impressed with Iowa's state park movement, the National Park Service requested a conference on state parks held in Des Moines in 1921. In the 1930's the Civilian Conservation Corps made many park improvements and built many stone shelters, lodges & beach houses. You can see improvements in progress today if you walk at Geode State Park, where the lake is drained to make improvements and ensure water quality.

Fall is here in Iowa and which brings cooler temperatures and lower humidity, perfect walking weather!! The Iowa state park walks are open until **October 15, 2020**. You still have time to enjoy a walk or two, it's especially beautiful with the fall colors.

TIME TO ORDER YOUR (WALK WITH AMERICA'S VETERANS) WWAV SPECIAL PROGRAM BOOK(S):

The goal of this special program is to walk for fitness while discovering the many ways our country's veterans are honored for their military service. "Collect" 15 different qualifiers in the logbooks for 6 different awards which are military "challenge" coins that honor the six military services. Each qualifier is:



-An individual fixed memorial, identifiable on any civic map.

-A local display program that honors veterans (all similar and related banners, for example, are ONE qualifier as a single "program").

-A building that is the location of any veterans' organization, or any government body that supports veterans.
-A memorial to victims of 9/11 attacks that identifies the Pentagon by name, or a veteran who was killed on that day.
-A road marker giving "Blue Star" or other designation to honor a GROUP of veterans, or a park or space that honors veterans. (NOT individuals unless the "memorial" name is for a veteran who is being honored for military service --

usually KIA-- not just a politician or other notable who was a veteran.)

-Individual grave markers or headstones for veterans do not qualify.

ONE qualifier is collected with each AVA: America's Walking Club stamp.

When in doubt about a qualifier, post a question with a picture in the new Facebook group created to administer and discuss this special program, or ask the POC below.

All qualifiers must be for military service from 1890 to the present, nothing earlier (Revolutionary or Civil War) will count.

Each "entry" in the logbook is an AVA-stamp PLUS the name/ picture/ description of the qualifier and location. When using a TGW or GW stamp, the sanction number is also required. Qualifiers can only be used once in a book or in a year, whichever comes first. (A new year on the AVA stamp allows a repeat of the qualifier in the same book.)

Program dates: **1 January 2021 to 31 December 2023** (Tentative end which could change based on the popularity of the program)
